Dear Friends in Christ,

The Gospel reading for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time of year C gives us a rich image of evangelization and also the challenges of doing it.

“The harvest is abundant,” our Lord said, “but the laborers are few.” This was the reality not of the past, but also of here and now. The laborers are what concerned our Lord. Evangelization is NOT ONLY the job of the ordained ministers, religious brothers and sister, or the catechists, BUT ALSO of everyone who was baptized in the name of the Most Holy Trinity.

Each one of us is called to be a witness for Christ which means to bring Christ to others. Each of us comes from a different place or background in life, yet we are called to do one task: make Christ visible or more visible to others.

We will go through being mocked, ridiculed, disdained, laughed at, slandered, misunderstood, rejected, mistreated and you name them. These cannot stop us evangelizing others because Christ is with us and our trust is in Him. We must pray that “*The Master of the harvest*” will send more laborers for His harvest. Did you pray for this?

God will do wonderful things for us and His peace will be upon us and in us. Peace is what we will offer first to people: “*Peace to this household.*” Absolutely, this is not the “*peace of the world;*” this is true peace from God; this peace will calm us down though we are in the midst of storm.

Pray more for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Let our prayer be more “*concrete*” with our sacrifices. Participate in catechizing our children and our youth here in this community by words and good examples spiritually and morally.

“*Rejoice because your names are written in heaven,*” not because “*the spirits are subject to you.*” We cannot “*rejoice*” if we ignore the call from the Lord Jesus Christ to evangelize, to witness the Gospel and to be faithful.

### Our Parish Office will be closed this Monday, July 4<sup>th</sup>.

You may wonder, "Why do we celebrate the 4th of July? What does it mean?" Well, this day is incredibly significant in American history, as it marks the day the United States officially became its own nation. The

Declaration of Independence was adopted on July 4th, 1776 - and thus, America was born. July 4th marks the birthday of the United States. Many commemorate the occasion with fireworks, cookouts, or displaying an American flag. But are there any biblical reasons Christians can find to celebrate Independence Day? Scripture offers at least four clear reasons.

1. **Gratitude for Religious Freedom** First, America offers significant religious freedom for Christians (and others) to freely worship.
2. **Appreciation for Those Who Defend Our Freedom** Second, Christians can thank God for those who serve and have given their lives to defend our freedom.
3. **Thanksgiving for the Opportunity to Participate in Government** Third, we can thank God for the opportunity to participate in the democratic process of our nation.
4. **Thankfulness for Peace with Family, Neighbors, and Friends** Fourth, we can express appreciation for a nation at peace.

**Diocesan Requirements for Reporting Ministry-Related Sexual Abuse of a Minor:** Any individual having actual knowledge of or reasonable cause to suspect an incident of ministry-related sexual abuse is to immediately report the incident to the Chancery. After the incident is reported, the Chancery will then report the incident to the proper civil authorities. The individual reporting the incident to the Chancery will be notified of the particulars regarding the Chancery's filing of the incident with the civil authorities. The reporting is not intended to supersede the right of an individual to make a report to civil authorities, but is to ensure proper, complete and timely reporting. Should an individual choose to make a report to civil authority, a report is still to be made to the Chancery.
