Dear Friends in Christ,

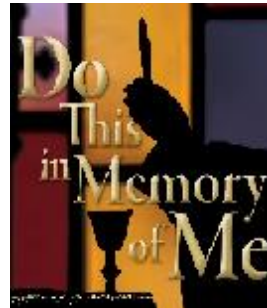
We are in the Twelfth Week in Ordinary time. In the gospel Jesus asks His disciples: *"Do you not yet have faith?"* when they were terrified dealing with the violent wind and waves on the sea. If we put ourselves in their situation, what would our reaction be, particularly when we see one person who does not care what is going on?

When we deal with difficulties in our lives, to whom do we turn for help? Certainly, we need to know the person who is the expert on the issue with which we are dealing. Then, we need to trust in that person. There is no one who is the expert in everything; however, there is one person to whom we can come for help in everything. You know who I am talking about: Jesus Christ.

If we know Jesus is the one to whom we should come for help, do we have faith in Him? I mean **"true and firm"** faith, not **"cafeteria"** faith. Our true faith must be expressed through the way we live our lives, the way we celebrate our faith, and the way we submit our lives to Jesus Christ. Knowing who Jesus is and having faith in Him are two different things.

There is no doubt that our faith in Jesus will be tested. There is no question that we will face challenges and difficulties when we truly live out our faith. There is no doubt that in following Jesus, accepting and obeying what He taught, we will be mocked, laughed at, persecuted by the secular world. These are the violent wind and waves that we Christians cannot avoid when we want to be with and in "the boat" of Christ: the Church.

We have our Master, Jesus Christ, with us in the boat, but don't we often forget His "Real Presence" with us? Two weeks ago the Church just reminded us of *this reality* through the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Did we forget?



Come to know Jesus more, particularly through the celebration of the Eucharist, and adoration of the Blessed Sacrament; trust in Him, (particularly in His divine mercy in the sacrament of Reconciliation); submit your life to His love, care and protection by keeping His commandments and laws through the true teaching of the Church.

May we know and love Jesus more. Amen.
