 \mathcal{D} ear Friends in Christ,

Let us meditate a little bit about this verse from the Gospel of the Fourth Sunday of Lent as Jesus said: "For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed."

 \mathcal{F} irst, we need to say thanks to the Lord for letting us recognize His Light, inviting to live under His Light, and helping us to remain in His Light. Next, we need to say thanks to the Church for sharing that Light with us.

We all know that Jesus is the Light of the world. This Light came to the world, but people "preferred darkness to light." Why is that? That is "because their works were evil."

When our pride is "too big," there is no place for the virtue of humility to work; there will be no recognizing "the wicked things" that we have done. And we continue to live in the darkness of sin.

Being prideful is one of the biggest obstacles, I think, for us to come toward the Light of Christ. The Light of Christ is bright enough to expose the smallest wicked things. Under the Light of Christ, nothing can be hidden.

One day we will stand before the Light of Christ, and our life will be exposed under that Light. We will not be able to "argue" or "bargain" with God. Our life on earth - how we welcome, approach and live under that Light- would be

our verdict. In other words, we would have known "our eternal verdict" (based on God's laws and commandments and decrees, which is the Light) already while we are still on earth! Each of us is the one to "give" the verdict to himself or herself. Here on earth, God still gives us chances to "change" our unfavorable verdict.

Let us come to the True Light of God, and let the radiance of this Light shine upon us. The Light may "irritate" our eyes for seconds, but after that we can see clearly. We can live in the Light without any irritations. We will live with peace and joy that only God can provide.

"Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God."

During the last few weeks of Lent, let us pray to God for ourselves and others that God will give us courage and humility to come toward the Light if we are not living in His Light yet. Let us also pray for strength and (again) humility, so that we will live and remain in His Light. The Light will lead us to the Eternal Kingdom, where many have tried to enter but could not get in!

That with your saints I may be Praising you, forever and ever. Amen
