 \mathcal{D} ear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate "GAUDETE" Sunday. This is another name for the Third Sunday of Advent stemming from the first Latin word of the Entrance Antiphon: "Gaudete" (Rejoice). Today the rose-colored or silver-colored vestments are allowed which signifies a sign of joy that all the Church feels at the nearness of the Redemption when the Savior will be born as God promised.

Yes, we rejoice in God our Savior, and He is coming. It is not only us who will rejoice, but also the desert and the parched land will exult, the steppe will bloom with abundant flowers. The whole creation will rejoice. This long-awaited Messiah came, changed and made all things possible in God's plan of salvation.

Sadly, many have not wanted to recognize Him, accept Him, follow Him, and be faithful to Him. Jesus Christ, however, does not give up on them. He constantly and patiently calls, invites, waits and waits and waits. He does not stop "performing" miracles to open their eyes. What miracles does He do?

Prophet Isaiah proclaims that the eyes of the blind will be opened; the ears of the deaf will be clear; the lame will leap like a stag; the tongue of the mute will sing; the ransomed will return; sorrow and mourning will flee, and so forth. These have become true in the lives of those who wait and believe in Jesus Christ, the Anointed One.

The joyous things, spiritually and/or physically, that Jesus brings to the world are for everyone. However, they will or will not become our joys depending on how we want to open our hearts, minds and souls to the messages of our Redeemer: Jesus Christ.

Is there any obstacle in you that may prevent the coming of Jesus into your "house"? Is there any obstacle that may stop the transformation of Jesus' joys into yours? Is there any "wall" in front of you that may block the way for Jesus coming to you?

God knows you more than you know yourself, and you know yourself more than anyone else. Spend some quiet time to face yourself with God and to see directly into you, so you can realize first what is/are your obstacle(s), then figure out how to level the mountain and straighten the paths.

Being ready for the coming of Jesus and inviting Him into our house, WE WILL REJOICE for He comes to save us.
