## OCTOBER - THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY

By tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates each month of the year to a certain devotion. The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary. The feast of the Rosary is held on October 7th in memory of the glorious and triumphant victory at the battle of Lepanto. That battle was the most convincing military victory that proved without a doubt the great power of the Rosary.

The month of October is a good time to commit to praying the Rosary every day. The Rosary will bring great peace and holiness to your life. It is a powerful instrument for conversion. The Rosary is the best method of honoring Mary.

It protects the Church from false teachings and keeps her safe from the attacks from the Enemy.



The experience of the Saints bear witness to it: this popular Marian prayer [the Holy Rosary] is a precious spiritual means to grow in intimacy with Jesus, and to learn at the school of the Blessed Virgin always to fulfil the divine will.

To be apostles of the Rosary, it is necessary to experience personally the beauty and depth of this prayer which is simple and accessible to everyone. It is first of all necessary to let the Blessed Virgin take one by the hand to contemplate the Face of Christ: a joyful, luminous, sorrowful and glorious Face. Those who, like Mary and with her, cherish and ponder the mysteries of Jesus carefully, increasingly understand His sentiments and are conformed to Him.

#### Who is St. Teresa of Jesus?

Feast Day - October 15

Mystic - Teacher of Prayer - Doctor of the Church

Saint Teresa of Jesus, also known as Saint Teresa of Avila, lived in Spain during the 16th Century. Her life as a Carmelite, though far removed from the mainstream of modern culture, still speaks powerfully to us today.



Teresa entered the Carmelite Monastery in 1535, at the age of 20. After years of struggling with her prayer life, Teresa felt that she was still living in shadow rather than in God's light. Repeatedly, she asked God to help her... It was not until 1554 that she experienced the conversion that would mark the rest of her life. ... it set her on a whole new pathway that led her to an intimate experience of God. In visions and locutions, God poured out His love on His daughter, who had become a willing and open receptacle. With God so close to her, not only was Teresa able to change her own ways, but she also came to realize that God wanted her to begin reforming the Carmelites. Convinced that God was with her, she set about reforming the Carmelite order, founding new houses, with a renewed spirit of detachment, charity, and obedience.

Fortunately, Teresa's superiors ordered her to document the remarkable events of her life and her original works exist today: The Autobiography of St. Teresa, The Way of Perfection, and The Interior Castle are some of her writings. It is through these profoundly human yet mystical writings that we may experience the spirit of Teresa, and enter into her remarkable path to God. These books are available in our Parish Library.

Teresa died in 1582, at the age of 67. In 1622 she was canonized, and in 1970, Pope Paul VI declared her a Doctor of the Church, the first woman ever to be so recognized.
