Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope you had a blessed Christmas and Happy New Year, with lots of true spiritual resolutions (the resolutions that you will do and can do with your effort and God's help). I believe they surely will bring you closer to God, His Church, your family and this faith-filled family at Saint Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Franklin.

 \mathcal{T} oday the Church celebrates the Epiphany of the Lord in which God revealed Himself to all nations (not only to the His chosen people Israel) through the recognition and paying homage of the Three Wise Men — the Magi.

The salvation is proclaimed and extended to every nation on earth. There is no exception. The question is: Does every nation welcome this good news? God's first chosen people, however, are still waiting and looking for that salvation which has been revealed and proclaimed. Every prophecy in the past about the long-awaited Messiah had been fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Therefore, love Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord, and love His Church as well.

Then, how do you love the Church? It is easy to answer this question, isn't it? Listen to her and obey her; first in the matter of faith and morals, second in other advices from her. Wow! In reality many of us only "pick and choose" what we like; just like when we go to a buffet restaurant and pick and choose what we want to eat.

May we continue to be "Wise" people and share the Good News from Heaven with others. May we share our love for Him with the strength and courage we receive from our Lord Jesus Christ and our Savior who today reveals to every nation His saving plan. Amen.

There will be no Ocia-Adult Education on Monday night January 5th. Deacon David and the Education team.


