Dear Friends in Christ,

Our responsorial psalm on the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time of year A is: "Blessed are they who follow the law of the Lord!"

Actually, all the readings this week mention the Law of God. The Law of the Lord was made known to us in several ways: written or oral law or "printed" law in the human heart.

When you listen to the responsorial psalm, can you sincerely tell yourself that you belong to the "THEY" who are blessed because you do follow the Law of the Lord? In the first reading from the Book of Sirach, it mentioned choosing between "fire and water," between "life and death," between "good and evil." How often have we chosen "fire" over "water," "death" over "life" or "evil" over "good?" Of course, God always "respects" the gift that He gave to every human being: **FREE WILL**.



When we decide to choose "fire over water," "death over life" or "evil over good," God does not "jump in" to take our free will away making us a "machine." Put it in the words of the first reading "whichever he chooses shall be given him." Therefore, every human being is totally accountable before God for every action or decision he/she has made in life.

The Gospel also mentions about four sins that people often commit or about the law of God that we are tempted to make look "OK": anger, lust/adultery, divorce and false swearing/oath.

God's wisdom is "IMMENSE," "He is mighty in power and all-seeing." God knows what is best for us and what we have to keep in order to have eternal life with Him in heaven, or to have eternal life with Satan in Hell. When we do not like any law of the Lord or of the Church (which Jesus gave the power to govern, teach and preach in His Name), we react in many ways: we don't want to follow; we challenge; we ignore or we "twist" the Law. And we think it is OK or it is fine! No one "dies" because they did not follow God's Law or the Church's Law!

The Law of the Lord has been established and given to human kind. It is up to each of us to choose with our free will: being blessed or being cursed, having eternal life with God in Heaven or with Satan in Hell, being free or being "thrown into prison."

Friends in Christ, we do have choices to make. May the Holy Spirit guide us to make the **RIGHT** and **GOOD CHOICE** that will please God, and give us courage and strength to keep that right and good choice until the day we stand before the Almighty God. Amen.
