



THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT
SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 22, 2026



Dear Friends in Christ,

On Ash Wednesday we received ashes on our foreheads. We have begun our Lent. We call this: the Holy Lenten season for this is the time of salvation and the time that the Church calls all of her children to become holy and holier by fasting, praying, and practicing self-sacrifice and charity.

This is also the time given to us to seriously look deeper into our heart and mind and find out what prevents us from coming closer to God. What sins, particularly *the seven deadly sins*, or what bad habits have been keeping us away from God (not going to Church on Sunday and Holy Days of obligation, not receiving God's Divine Grace frequently in the Sacraments, especially Penance and the Eucharist, not practicing God's Commandments and His Church's teaching on faith and morals.)

The temptation is, once again, so sweet, so attractive, so persuading and convincing, and so often it does "make sense" to human wisdom! The first Adam was so weak; he fell into the temptation so easily and quickly (based on the narrative of the Book of Genesis). On the contrary, Jesus, the New Adam, is so strong. He defeated Satan by using the POWER of the WORD of GOD!

We are all tempted; we are weak too. However, we do receive the HELP from our Savior Jesus Christ through the Sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and Penance. By the way, when was the last time you have reconciled with God? How many times have you received Jesus in the Holy Eucharist without confessing the mortal sins on your soul and thought that it was OK?

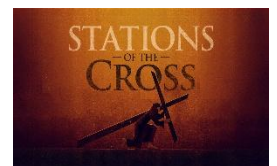
Friends, the call to conversion is not only reserved for Lent (forty days), but for our whole life. Nevertheless, the Church wants to reserve these Forty Days of Lent first, to follow the example of Jesus preparing Himself in the desert by fasting and praying for forty days before He went into His public ministry - doing His Father's will - that led Him to Calvary to be crucified for the sins of the whole world. Secondly, the Church wants to prepare us more effectively to celebrate the most powerful and joyful event of our Christian faith: The Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Without dying with Jesus and for Jesus, we will not share in His glory; we will not be raised with Him on the last day to join our Savior in Heaven. The secular world wants us to die for material things, in pleasures of the flesh, in hatred and resentments, in unfaithfulness and deceiving, in "grey" morality (no right and no wrong; everything is just OK) . . . which will lead us to damnation (by our OWN CHOICE).

May this Gracious Lenten Season open the holy way and lead us back to God and His Church with our humility and sincerity. Amen.
