Dear Friends in Christ,

Today we celebrate the central mystery of Christian faith and life: The Most Holy Trinity: One God in Three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. “The Trinity is a mystery of faith in a strict sense, one of the ‘mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God’” (CCC #237). This mystery is inaccessible to reason alone. To understand this mystery we must be like God. In other words, we must have the same nature as His, but it can never happen because we are His creatures.

It is the true and unconditional love that “connects” three distinct and equal Persons in ONE God. That love is shared with each person and is reflected in nature. That love has been shown to us in a concrete and visible way through the incarnation, passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ - the Second Person of the Most Holy Trinity.

It is the model of love that we, the Church, this community, our country and society, and our families, need to be molded into. Of course, we cannot have the perfect love like the Most Holy Trinity has among Three Persons, but at least we should look into that love and try to bring part of it and make it a reality to our Church, community, country, society, and families.

If we just try to have “a little bit more” of **humility** to listen to one another or to let our ego “rest in peace”, we can work together to make this faith community more vivid and loving.

If we just try “a little bit more” to let **forgiveness** reign in our community, we can come together as true brothers and sisters in Christ, and the Church’s wounds would be healed.

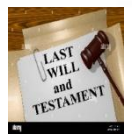
If we just try to practice “a little bit more” of **obedience**, we will live in unity and peace in the Church, actually with God - the Most Holy Trinity.
